Please make sure that if you are in car line that your name is displayed clearly for our teachers to see. If you need a new placard, please let the office know and we will send one home.

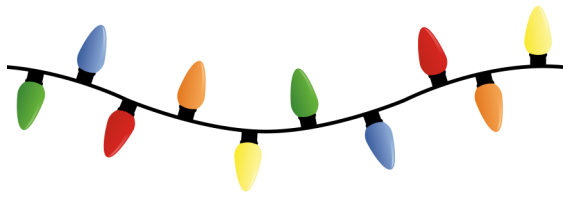
